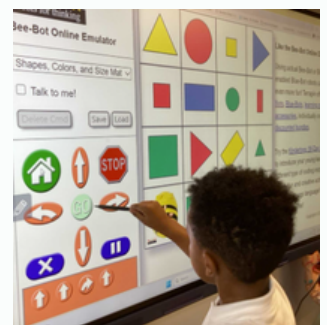
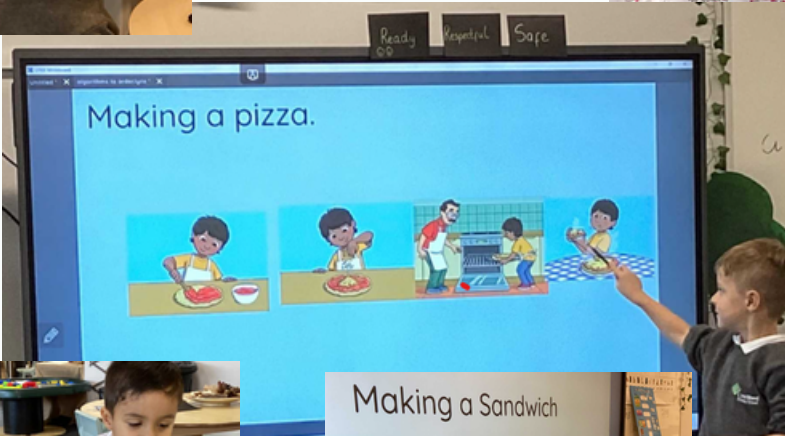

Following their experiences of coding last year, Year 1 have continued to develop their computational thinking during Coding Week this week.

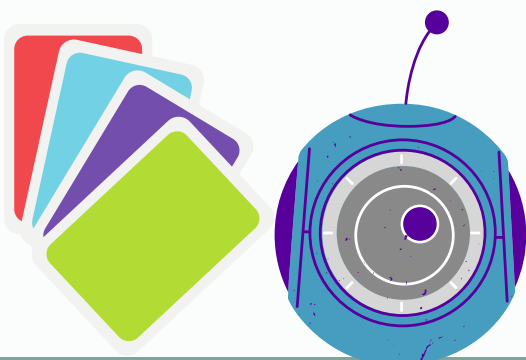
They have used the Bee-bots to focus on:
