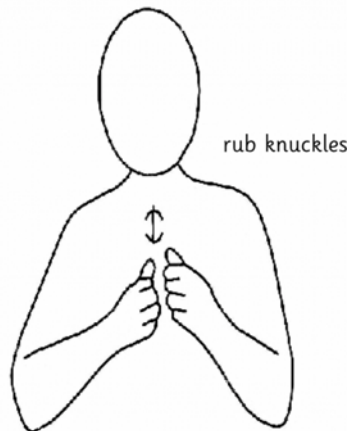
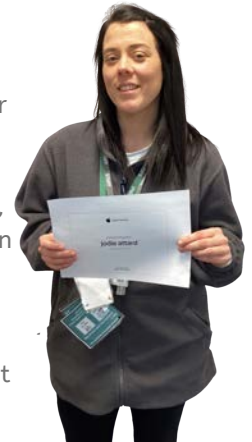

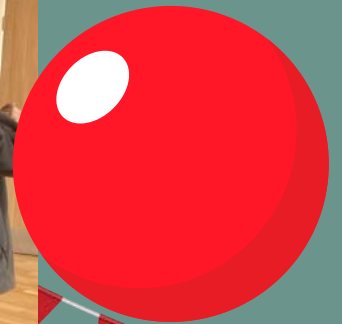

**Diversity**  
The rich cultural diversity in our community is reflected in the way families bring up their children. Approaches to being a parent can vary within families, ethnic groups and communities. British society acknowledges and affirms cultural diversity but children, whatever their cultural background, always have a right to be protected. Anything that causes harm to a child, whether part of a cultural or faith tradition, is never acceptable. Some practices that may be culturally acceptable in some countries are banned by law in the United Kingdom.

1. Get to know your child
2. Listen to your child
3. Be as positive as you can
4. Keep the rules simple
5. Be consistent
6. Reason and discuss matters with your child
7. Provide positive opportunities
8. Agree sanctions with the child
9. The behaviour is bad - not the child
10. Ask for help

## Disciplining Your Children A Guide For Parents



**Child Protection - What's it got to do with that?**  
Parents and carers want the best for their children. They help their children to grow, care and protect them from harm. Their behaviour, boundaries and rules are important for their children's safety and well-being. If a child is in danger or at risk of harm, it is the responsibility of the parent or carer to take action to protect the child. This may mean reporting the incident to the police or other relevant agencies. This leads to greater safety for the children.

The aim of the leaflet is to support parents and carers to help children to manage their children's behaviour well with others in their own living situations.

**The Law - how it applies to you**  
UK law controls every child up to the age of 18 years. Your child is under the care of their parents or carer. It is your legal responsibility to protect your child from harm. It is also legal to use physical force to protect or to restrain a child from causing harm to themselves or others.

**Positive Parenting**

1. Have clear simple rules with them
2. Listen to your child
3. Lead by your own example
4. Praise and reward good behaviour
5. Be consistent
6. Reason and discuss matters with your child
7. Reach positive agreements
8. Agree sanctions with your child
9. Continue the behaviour you do not like, 10/20 year old
10. Ask for help before you feel overwhelmed

**Boundaries**  
All of us have children that we think are special. We get "hooked" about what we expect of children and think if there are boundaries and rules, we can control them. Boundaries and rules are important, children can become confident if they are clear on their boundaries and holding their own sense of responsibility. They should be able to trust and respect those in their lives. Give them a chance to discuss their rules and to have their own input. Remember, being strict does not mean a good mother but it means the child has a good mother.

**Consistency**  
The most important thing to remember is consistency. They need to know that their boundaries and rules are consistent. Having positive behaviour in general is more effective than punishing bad behaviour. Praise and encouragement are powerful for promoting positive behaviour. It is important to be consistent and fair.
