



Never rush; remember to pause.

Open-ended questions encourage your child to use more words in their response to you.

"I wonder if..."
"What do you think..."
"Tell me..."






Bilingual parents

- You do not have to share the books in English. Your child will hear the story three times a week in English at nursery.
- You can support your child's skills by speaking the language(s) that you are most confident in.
- Giving your child another language to understand and talk in, is not a disadvantage – it is a **bonus**!

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
Speaking more than one language

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More than half the world's people speak more than one language and there's no one right way to do it.

All families are different, so decide together what your multilingual family will be like.



The more you talk in your languages, the more your baby will learn your languages - the whole family can get involved!

Babies' brains are amazing! They can learn any language that they hear around them even more than one language at a time.





Talk to your baby in the languages you are most comfortable with. If your child learns one language well from you, it will be easier for them to learn English well too.

When you share your languages, you share your feelings and your stories. Be proud of your languages and share them like a gift!
