# Tri-borough SEND Newsletter

Bromley Healthcare provides Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND) support to people living in Bromley, Bexley and Greenwich, in partnership with other key professionals and networks.



Welcome to the latest edition of the Tri-borough SEND Newsletter! We aim to publish these to you every 6 to 8 weeks. This edition of the newsletter informs you about supermarket quiet hour, shopping aids, the Sunflower Scheme, anti-bullying week, preparing for Christmas, quiet Santa sessions, and relaxed theatre performances.



### Supermarket quiet hour

Morrisons operates quiet hours between 2pm to 3pm every Monday to Thursday, 9am and 10am on Saturdays, and for the first hour of opening on Sundays. The initiative is for people who may struggle with music and other loud noises, for example those who have been diagnosed as autistic.

Morrisons introduces new afternoon quiet hour to help shoppers (morrisons-corporate.com)

Asda recognise that large, busy supermarkets can be noisy and overwhelming for some customers, so they help by operating a Quieter Hour, Monday to Thursday between 2–3pm in our large stores. They turn Asda Radio off, and their colleagues work quietly, acknowledging this hour as quiet time to support customers with additional needs or hidden disabilities.

Tesco is a place where 'Everyone's Welcome', but they understand that their stores – with the loud noises, bright lights or strong smells, and volume of people – can be stressful for some of their customers. They want to help deliver the easiest shopping trip for everyone in their stores – so every Wednesday and Saturday, from 9am-10am, they will dim the lights and lower the Checkouts noise in all of their larger stores, to make it a more enjoyable experience for customers.

### What is a relaxed Theatre performance?



A relaxed performance is a show that's been adapted to suit people who might require a more relaxed environment when going to the theatre. Usually, these are adults or children with learning difficulties, autism, or sensory communication disorders.



Individuals with conditions like these may find standard theatre performances to be overwhelming or unpleasant. This can be attributed to triggers such as darkness, loud music, sudden noises, and an unfamiliar environment where one is expected to remain still and quiet for an extended period.

For some events, some technical changes may have been made to the performance – this can include quieter music, reducing loud or surprising sound effects and avoiding strobe lighting.
